### What Are Batches?

Batches are how applications are tracked and sent to the respective Approval Authority for each Service Component. This system allows customers to track their application progress. Once the application is reviewed, it is placed on a List that is forwarded for final review and signature from the approval authority (DCS is not the final approval authority). Once the List is returned, we can then produce the card.

## PATRIOT'S POINT



**Mr. Salvador Hernandez** is the Chief of the Weapons Management Division at the Air Force Security Forces Center, Joint Base San Antonio Lackland TX.

He is responsible for the management of the Air Force Non-Lethal Weapons Program; providing support to the DoD Non-Lethal Weapons Program, Headquarters Air Force Director of Security Forces, and more than 38,000 Active-Duty and Reserve component Security Forces at locations worldwide. Additionally, his division provides support to all Air Force

warfighters with lethal capabilities and technologies, by providing management oversight of the Air Force's Small Arms and Light Weapons program, and ground munitions.

Mr. Hernandez is a career Security Forces member and retired after 21 years of active duty service as a Requirements Officer for Headquarters Air Force Security Forces Center, Lackland Air Base Texas. After retirement from active duty he joined the ranks of civil service and has become the Air Force's foremost authority on non-lethal weapons. He is credited with introducing the TASER® conducted electrical weapon into the Air Force inventory and the development of the first non-lethal weapons capability set for use by the security forces career field. Working with the Air Force Research Laboratory and the Joint Non-Lethal Weapons Directorate he was an early pioneer of mounting a non-lethal directed energy weapon on a mobile weapons platform; the Active Denial System. His division's charter in keeping pace with new and more lethal systems has resulted in the fielding of a new Air Force modular handgun system and a 40 millimeter grenade launcher system, replacing current aging system. Mr. Hernandez is a native Texan raised in El Paso and is a graduate of Webster University and holds a Dual Master Degree in Human Resources Development and Personnel Management.

Since March 2016, Army Lists 1-23 have been completed and mailed out (2237 cards).

List 24 (70 cards) is currently with OPMG for approval/signature. Batch 39 is now being assembled at our San Antonio Office. Applications that are not ready are dropped back to the next List.

### Navy LEOSA

At the present time, [www.leosanavy.com](http://www.leosanavy.com) is still temporarily offline. All applications already received or in route to DCS will continue to be processed as normal.

**List 3** is still with the Navy PM for approval/signature.

We are in continual contact with Mr. Callahan, and he assures us the issue will be rectified as soon as possible, and the site will be reactivated at that time.

The Navy has also rescinded the requirement that applicants must be at least 21 years of age to apply.
