What Are Batches?

Batches are how applications are tracked and sent to the respective Approval Authority for each Service Component. This system allows customers to track their application progress. Once the application is reviewed, it is placed on a List that is forwarded for final review and signature from the approval authority (DCS is not the final approval authority). Once the List is returned, we can then produce the card.

Army LEOSA

Since March 2016, Army Lists 1-23 have been completed and mailed out. **List 23** was made up of 96 cards and 26 service requests.

List 24 is currently at OPMG for approval/signature. **Batch 37** is now being assembled at our San Antonio office. Applications that are not ready are dropped back to the next List.

Navy LEOSA

At the present time, www.leosanavy.com is still temporarily offline. All applications already received or in route to DCS will continue to be processed as normal.

List 3 is still with the Navy PM for review/approval/signature. Once we receive the final signed list back, we will produce the cards (80+ approved applications). This part of the program is continuing as normal.

The Navy has also rescinded the requirement that applicants must be at least 21 years of age to apply.
